HAY FESTIVAL COLOMBIA 2024

The 19th Hay Festival in Colombia was held with events dedicated to literature, science and the history of art, as well as exchanges of ideas from south to south, with **10 days of inclusive activities for all**, with some of the most important international figures in culture and science, and a total attendance of **62,050 people**.

With a cutting-edge, inspiring festival programme, audiences, who attended both digitally and in person, were able to interact with over **200 guests** who shared their stories and their thoughts, offering a range of possibilities and options and confirming the diversity and wealth of narratives that can give us new ways of seeing the world. The Hay Festival 2024 has been a feast for the imagination and creativity, enjoyed by adults, young people and children. Additionally, on this occasion, **Bolívar residents were able to attend for free** the activities run on the last day in Cartagena de Indias.

This year there were conversations about **literature** and **ideas**, about **current topics**, **cultural legacies**, **bioethics**, the **future of the Amazon region** and valuable **south-to-south encounters**. Homage was paid to the Ukraine, the work of the publishing industry (**Talento Editorial**) and **cultural management** were celebrated, and six **reading clubs** were held. There was also some great **music** and **film**, with concerts and screenings.

Hay Joven events for the university community were run in Cartagena de Indias and Barranquilla, with **free entry for students** in 20% of the capacity of all the Cartagena de Indias activities. Children had special events designed for them at the **Hay Comunitario** both in Cartagena de Indias and in Jerico.



In **literature** we had some outstanding authors, including **Javier Moro**, **Julia Navarro**, **Eduardo Romero García**, **Irene Solà**, **Gabi Martínez** and **Alana S. Portero** from Spain. Also, **Geoff Dyer** (United Kingdom), **In Koli Jean Bofane** (Congo/Belgium), **Jorge Comensal** (Mexico), **Benjamín Labatut** (Chile), **Gabriela Cabezón Cámara** and **Selva Almada** (Argentina); **Hisham Matar** (Libya/United States), **André Aciman** (Egypt/United States) and **Adania Shibli** (Palestine), were speaking.

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HAY FESTIVAL EDUCATION

The Hay Festival has restated its commitment to educational and professional training processes, with more extensive **Hay Joven** and **Hay Comunitario** programmes, and a second round of Hay Festival **Excellency Grants**. A full agenda of free activities for children and young people was offered at universities, schools, cultural centres, foundations and libraries.



HAY COMUNITARIO

Hay **Comunitario** is the programme run by the Hay Festival with **local people**, mainly children, outside the old quarter. This year there were **24 activities**, 20 in the **neighbourhoods** and **on the outskirts** of Cartagena de Indias and four at the Centro de Formación de la Cooperación Española with groups from the municipalities of Bayunca, San Jacinto and Turbaco.

850 children, teenagers and adults were a part of this story, which reached the districts of El Pozón, Nelson Mandela, Olaya Herrera, Tierra Baja, Puerto Rey, La Boquilla, Membrillal and Barú, as well as the municipalities of Malagana and Clemencia.

Together with the **Fundación PLAN**, which has been working with the Hay Festival in Colombia for 19 years, on Thursday 25 January the opening event took place at the 14 de Febrero Educational Institution with the palenquero band **Las estrellas del Caribe** and with coverage by our **community reporters** led by the journalist **Catalina Gómez Ángel**, who gave a classic **community journalism workshop**. From then until 28 January, activities were carried out with: **Irene Vasco, Juliana Muñoz Toro, Pilar Lozano, Gerardo Meneses, Valentina Toro, Beatriz Helena Robledo, José Andrés Gómez, Velia Vidal, Raúl Ballesteros, Javier Ortiz Cassiani** and **Elisa Guerra**.

In 2023, Hay Festival joined forces with self-managed community projects. Throughout 2023 a series of workshops for children were carried out, linked to these initiatives, and during the Hay Festival Cartagena de Indias **9 workshops** and **lectures** were given in these spaces. For these projects, the Hay Festival was delighted to join with **La Canoa Literaria** in Tierra Baja, **Corporación Ruleli** in Olaya neighbourhood and the **Biblioteca Popular Playa Blanca** in Barú.



HAY JOVEN

Hay Joven is the programme aimed at the university community. Within the framework of the Hay Festival Cartagena de Indias, from 25th to 27th of January, **24 activities** were held at the **University of Cartagena** (Claustro de la Merced and Claustro de San Agustín) and the **Universidad Tecnológica de Bolívar** (Manga campus). In Barranquilla there were five events at the **Universidad del Norte** on Monday 29th of January.

In Cartagena de Indias, around **800 students, lecturers and university staff** were a part of this experience, which included two journalism workshops, a creative writing workshop, a concert, the screening of a documentary and 19 conversations on literature, current affairs, ideas and cultural management.

The programme featured fiction writers such as the Argentinians **Gabriela Cabezón Cámara** and **Selva Almada**; **Irene Solà**, **Eduardo Romero García**, **Alana S. Portero**, **Gabriela Llanos** and **Álvaro Ortiz** from Spain; and **Dahlia de la Cerda** and **Jorge Comensal** from Mexico. Five contributors to the anthology *Verdades compartidas* and four to *Exploradores, soñadores y ladrones* spoke before the university audiences. The national artistic scene was represented by the musicians **Julio Victoria** and **Tei Shi**; the actor and writer **Margarita Rosa de Francisco**, the writer and teacher **Gerardo Meneses**; the cultural manager from Choco, Velia Vidal; the journalist and writer **Amalia Andrade** and a group of creators and educators from the Master's in Literature and Creative Writing at the Universidad del Norte. Local participants included **Brindy Cantillo Severich** and **Martín Murillo Gómez**, creators of the community reading promotion projects La Canoa Literaria and La Carreta Literaria, as well as the valuable contribution of moderators, mainly educators and graduates of the participating universities.

In Barranquilla, the art historian and writer **Katy Hessel** (United Kingdom), the historian **Jesús Sanjurjo-Ramos** (Spain) and the doctor and writer **Arnoldo Kraus** (Mexico) joined the programme, together with **Eduardo Romero García** and **Jorge Comensal**.

EXCELLENCY GRANTS

Hay Festival Cartagena de Indias offered eight scholarships to African-Colombian artists, cultural managers and creative industry professionals in the Department of Bolívar for the second round of the Hay Festival Excellency Grants.

On 15th, 17th and 24th of January, this selection of young people took part in training events linked to cultural management with the Colombian and international Hay Festival team and five local managers: **Andrea Bonilla** (Manager of the Cartagena Chamber of Commerce Cultural Experiences Cluster), **Jesús Herrera Babilonia** (graduate of the programme's first round and Culture Coordinator at the Casa Cultural Colombo Alemana), **Ricardo Chica Gelis** (Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences and Education at the University of Cartagena), **Martín Murillo** (creator of the Carreta Literaria, ¡Leamos! initiative) and **Cindy Patricia Herrera Estrada** (writer, educator, cultural manager and reading promotor).

From 25th to 28th of January, each selected person participated in a practical experience, joining the festival organisers in areas including **Education, Press, Media** and **Social Media**.
