## Make your own Bird Seed Balls

### What you will need:

- Lard
- Birdseed
- Pine Cone(s)
- Twine/String

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. Leave your lard out to warm to room temperature
- 2. Clean the pine cone(s), then tie a long piece of string around the base of each one
- 3. Mix the birdseed with lard until it all sticks together
- 4. Push the mixture between the pine cone scales to create your seed ball
- 5. Pop them in the fridge until the lard has set hard
- 6. Hang the seed balls in a quiet, sheltered area
