

BRECON JAZZ 2010 SAW A DIVERSE and exciting mixture of home-grown, experimental, and world music talents gathering in the Welsh market town of Brecon for one of the UK's leading family-friendly summer festivals.

For the second year running, the festival was organised by the team behind the Hay Festival in Hay-on-Wye.

Director of Hay Festivals and Brecon Jazz Peter Florence commented on 2010's line-up:



"Brecon reinvented itself as a youthful festival: a showcase for progressive music and emerging superstars. We brought together the most dynamic and accessible contemporary performers from Africa and Europe, while still presenting some of America and Britain's greatest instrumentalists and jazz stars, in the most beautiful of our National Parks."


