INTRODUCTION

The thirteenth edition of Hay Festival Cartagena 2018 filled Colombia with literature, film, art and music, contributing, once again, to the magic of these intense days of the festival. The festival comprised of 176 events, 42 stages in Cartagena, Medellin, Riohacha, Aracataca, Arjona, Carmen de Bolivar and Mompox among others, with more than 50,000 attendees having the pleasure of enjoying this great cultural event.



This edition of Hay Festival Cartagena hosted 182 participants coming from 31 countries. Great artists were part of the enlightening conversations of the festival – personalities such as the Nobel Prize in Literature winner J. M. Coetzee, the British writer Salman Rushdie, the Norwegian adventurer Erling Kagge, the Russian activist and singer Nadya Tolokno, the German writer Carolin Emcke, the Mexican scriptwriter Guillermo Arriaga and the Ghanaian-American novelist Yaa Gyasi. Other authors who sparked interest were the Spanish neurologist Jordi Montero, the Italian writer Andrea Marcolongo and the Spanish philosopher and essayist Marina Garcés. The festival became the meeting place for dialogue.

Hay Festival Cartagena is about culture and ideas, celebrating the arts and sciences through inclusive events that are accessible and lucid.

The programme includes talks, workshops, concerts and readings, with international experts in the fields of literature, science, film, music, human rights, journalism, environment and politics. The festival creates a space to celebrate the best cultural and scientific findings, a forum for dialogue, where ideas can be exchanged and critical thinking encouraged. The aim is to:

- become the most important annual cultural event in the Hispanic world.
- discuss literature at a local and international level, in order to promote dialogue, cultural exchange and progress.
- present inclusive and accessible events with international artists.
- promote social projects and education through outreach work.

Since 2006, Hay Festival and the Plan International have collaborated on Hay Festival Community, a social inclusion project that seeks to achieve transformations through the participation of children as active readers and writers. With a programme of literary and cultural activities for everyone, from 2017 we have reached out to the most vulnerable communities in Cartagena and Bolívar, bringing Colombian and international writers to communities such as **El Pozón**, **Membrillal**, **Bayunca**, **Tierra Baja**, **Puerto Rey** and **Boquilla**.



During the rest of the year we run the Crecer Leyendo (Growing Up) programme, with reading and writing activities aimed at children and young adults, in which thousands of children have found a passion for books that has greatly expanded their horizons.

- All events are free.
- 21 events for children and young adults were organized together with Plan Internacional in 14 neighbourhoods of Cartagena.
- Seven events were organized with Cartagena City Council and Bolivar Provincial Government (Cicuco, Arjona, San Estanislao, Santa Rosa de Lima, Mompox, Carmen de Bolívar, and San Jacinto).
- Several events took place with the writers of the Bogotá39-2017 list with the support of the Banco de la República in the cities of Manizales, Neiva, San Andrés, Buenaventura, Santa Marta, Medellín and Bogotá.
- ★ This year we had 31 events in which 29 figures from the world of culture participated.
- We ran events in 14 neighbourhoods in Cartagena and seven municipalities in Bolivar province.
- ★ There was one event in Aracataca with the support of the Ministry of Culture.



REVIEW OF BOGOTÁ39-2017

Hay Festival celebrated the **Bogotá39-2017**: a selection of the **best fiction writers under 40 from across Latin America** aiming to promote good literature by highlighting literary variety and talent in the region. In order to disseminate their works, it was decided to work with **14 independent publishing houses**. In addition, the Bogotá39-2017 have been showcased in a new anthology of work, published in both Spanish and English.

The final selection was done by an expert jury comprising three famous writers: **Darío Jaramillo** (Colombia), **Leila Guerriero** (Argentina) and **Carmen Boullosa** (Mexico), who were tasked with reading all submissions and compiling a shortlist. The announcement comes ten years after the first Bogotá 39 selection was made to mark Bogotá as World Book Capital 2007. The thirteenth edition of Hay Festival Cartagena had been the meeting point of the 39 selected writers. The members of this new Bogotá39-2017 list participated in **36 events** throughout **Cartagena**, **Bogotá**, **Medellin** and **Riohacha**.

This year, the **6th Hay Festival Medellin** took place from 23 - 26 January, thanks to the support of **Medellin City Council**. It featured more than 20 activities, that could be enjoyed for free at the **EAFIT University, the Parque Explora, as well as various city and COMFAMA stages and libraries**. More than **25 international guests** and the same number of Colombian speakers took part in stimulating discussions. The festival opens the city's cultural programme each year, and this time was attended by more than 6,500 people.

The 2018 Hay Festival Medellin presented major figures from the literary world, such as the poets **Rosemary Sullivan** and **Lee Maracle**, the author of many children's books **Nando López**, the scriptwriter **Guillermo Arriaga**, and some of the members of the **Bogotá39-2017** as well as **Alan Mills**, **Claudia Ulloa** and **Mauro Javier Cárdenas**, who talked about their own experience as authors. The music this year was provided by the band **The Suffers**, who revived a musical genre known as *Gulf Coast Soul*.



Hay Festival brings readers and writers together to share stories and ideas in sustainable events around the world. The festivals inspire, examine and entertain, inviting participants to imagine the world as it is and as it might be.

Hay Festival is an international celebration of arts and sciences that has been held for the past 30 years in Hay-on-Wye, a small town in Wales that is famous for its bookshops. The Festival lasts 11 days, hosts more than 700 events, debates, interviews and concerts. Its audience comes from the UK, Europe and the Americas.

Hay Festival has expanded to run Festivals around the world since 2006 including Hay Festival Cartagena de Indias (Colombia), Hay Festival Segovia (Spain) Hay Festival Queretaro (Mexico) and Hay Festival Arequipa (Peru). Hay curates '39' gatherings of emerging writers which has been run in Bogota (2007), Beirut (2010), Port Harcourt (Nigeria 2014), Mexico (2015), Aarhus, Denmark (2017) and Bogota 39 (2018) which selects and promotes 39 writers under 40.



Hay Festival is committed to:

- Maring literature locally and internationally in order to promote dialogue, cultural exchange, education and development.
- Presenting inclusive and accessible events with international artists, and contributing to social action and development;
- Providing free tickets to students in tertiary education, and to pupils on Schools Days at each festival.
- Working with local and international institutions, organisations and private companies, maximizing the impact of the festivals' connection with the local population.
- Increasing the impact of Hay Festival events through Hay Player reaching a global audience in English and Spanish languages.
